<u>Fiscal Consideration:</u> The amount of the option payments is a non-refundable \$1,000.00. However, if the options are exercised, the \$1,000.00 will be applied to the final purchase price of each contract.

> Total acquisition costs are estimated to be \$769,999.64 for the land plus \$86,595.58 for due diligence and closing services. The basis for these estimates is detailed below.

The final purchase prices shall be based on the final surveyed acreage times the following:

- \$12,743.03 per/acre for the Archie Carr F. III ownership,
- \$6,797.58 per/acre for the Carr, Carr, Carr & Carr ownership,
- \$9,820.00 per/acre for the McNab ownership.

A precise determination of the acreage in each parcel will be determined after a survey of the property.

In order to provide sufficient spending authority to cover an unanticipated change in acreage or other acquisition costs, staff is requesting authorization to expend an amount equal to the estimated acquisition and due diligence costs, plus 10%.
