Background:

The weirs were installed as part of the Newnans Lake Initiative. They divert stream flow into bioreactors for phosphorus removal. The County receives credit for the phosphorus load reduction in the Orange Creek BMAP as long as they are operational. A storm event in the spring and Hurricane Elsa in July downed trees next to the weirs which has allowed the Creek to bypass the weirs. As a result, water is no longer passing through the bioreactors. Restoring weir function requires their extension. There was also minor damage to the weirs themselves and erosion near the bioreactors. Having the same contractor who installed the weirs perform this work, impacts to the surrounding land will be minimized, matching materials will be used, and the function of the weirs can be restored faster and during the dry season when stream flow is lowest.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Approve and authorize Chair to sign single source form; approve Purchase Order 2022-1422 to TSI Disaster Recovery, LLC in the amount of \$96,600; and approve journal 2022-992, a budget amendment to move the needed funds from the capital category to operating.
