10. 22-0245 Lochloosa Creek Flatwoods - Brown Option Contract to Purchase Real Property

Fiscal Consideration:

The amount of the option payment is a non-refundable \$1,000.00. However, if the option is exercised, the \$1,000.00 will be applied to the final purchase price.

Total acquisition costs are estimated to be \$1,550,008.32 for the land plus \$141,056.25 for due diligence and closing services. The basis for these estimates is detailed below. The final purchase price will be based on \$2,544.00 per/acre multiplied by the surveyed acreage as defined in the Option Contract. A precise determination of the Lochloosa Creek Flatwoods - Brown total acres will not be known until a boundary survey is complete.

In order to provide sufficient spending authority to cover an unanticipated change in acreage or other acquisition costs, staff is requesting authorization to expend an amount equal to the estimated acquisition and due diligence costs, plus 10%. Any unused funds will remain in Fund 021 for future acquisitions.
