Recommended Action:

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- 1. Adopt master plan as presented.
- 2. Provide guidance to staff on the percentage split of infrastructure surtax proceeds dedicated for conservation lands and active parks to fully or partially implement the master plan.
- 3. Provide guidance to staff on whether or not surtax proceeds can be used for operations and maintenance costs, including staff.
- *Fiscal Consideration:* The new surtax effective January 1, 2023 should generate approximately \$188 million over 10 years for Conservation Lands and Parks and Open Spaces.

- **2.** <u>23-0392</u> Alachua County Forever/Land Conservation and Management Program 10-Year Plan Presentation
 - Approve implementation of the 10-year Land Conservation and Management Plan and strategies as presented.
 - Authorize funding, planning, and construction of the combined field support and office facility for the Land Conservation Program using WSPP surtax funds.
 - Provide direction and guidance to staff on the percentage split of WSPP infrastructure surtax proceeds to be dedicated to conservation lands and active parks for the 10-year surtax beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2032.
 - Provide guidance to staff on whether or not surtax proceeds can be used for operations and maintenance costs, including staff.
 - *<u>Fiscal Consideration:</u>* The new surtax effective January 1, 2023, should generate approximately \$188 million over 10 years for Conservation Lands and Parks and Open Spaces. Additionally, there is approximately \$22 million remaining from the expired surtax for Conservation Land.
